### **Minimum Crew Ballot**

**10th June 2014**

Dear Colleague,

As per our last communication, a meeting took place between Unite and Thomas Cook yesterday in an attempt to try to resolve the current dispute over the imposition of minimum crew. ACAS were also in attendance to assist the process. As a gesture of goodwill, Unite had committed to suspend the planned industrial action ballot whilst these talks took place.

Unfortunately, the day did not deliver anywhere near the movement from the Company which would indicate a true desire to resolve this dispute. There is a second meeting due to take place on Friday 13th June, and your reps will continue to work hard to secure the best outcome. Unite however do have a mandate from our membership, and as today did not meet any of the desired expectations, the Ballot Notice is going to be served on the Company this week. Your reps and Unite do need to stress that this is not any indication of what the outcome of any further talks may be, but if they do not produce a satisfactory outcome then, the industrial action ballot will be sent out to you next week.
